Wounded Serviceman Named Honoree for the 14th Annual Sticks for Soldiers Thanksgiving Charity Lacrosse Tournament on November 30th, Fairfield, CT.

Fairfield, Conn., November 21, 2019 – United States Army Captain (Ret) Peter Antioho has been named the honoree and beneficiary for this years' 14th annual **Sticks for Soldiers Thanksgiving Charity Lacrosse Tournament**, hosted by the Fairfield Ludlowe High School boy's lacrosse program on Saturday, November 30th. CPT Antioho sustained lifechanging injuries from exposure to open burn pits while deployed in Afghanistan in 2012.

Sticks for Soldiers is a non-profit charity with its mission to raise money to support future needs of severely-wounded soldiers, and promote youth awareness of military service through this state-wide event. In 13 years, the tournament, which is held every year on the Saturday after Thanksgiving, has raised nearly \$900,000 through team entry fees, silent auction, merchandise, and corporate and private donations. This year, more than 650 boys and girls from 45 Connecticut high school teams are expected to participate and play 70 games during the one-day event. Game officials from around the state of Connecticut will donate their time as well as many volunteers from Fairfield Ludlowe High School and the surrounding communities. This is the players' opportunity to give thanks, provide support and raise awareness of our service members. The goal this year is to raise \$100,000, which will directly benefit these, and other, severely wounded honorees.

2019 14th Annual Honoree

United States Army Captain Peter D. Antioho

Captain Antioho served from 2009 through 2015. He was an Infantry Officer with the 4th Infantry Division, Fort Carson, CO. While deployed in Afghanistan in 2012, CPT Antioho had to walk daily through heavy smoke emanating from burn pits as he performed his job as second in command on his base. A variety of items, including human and animal waste, plastic, ammunition and batteries were burned with diesel fuel 24 hours a day in open pits. He was diagnosed with glioblastoma multiforme brain cancer two years ago.

The West Point graduate and Berlin resident was 31 when he was diagnosed, young for this cancer. He was second in command at his base, but now, with symptoms that include memory loss and impaired vision, speech and motor function, he is unable to work.

Peter spends his days getting physical and occupational therapy at Gaylord Specialty Healthcare in Wallingford; social work and other health care at the Newington VA; and cancer care at Smilow Cancer Hospital in New Haven. He and his wife, his full-time caregiver, have a 3-year-old son.

Held on Thanksgiving Saturday, it is sponsored by the Fairfield Ludlowe High School lacrosse team. The mission of the tournament is to provide support and give thanks to the service men and women who put their lives on the line and sacrificed for our country, while raising awareness among high school athletes to the sacrifices being made by people just a few years older than they are. Through their play and fund-raising participation, the athletes demonstrate their tangible thanks and support. Originating in 2006, the idea came from long-time lacrosse advocate Mike Voucas along with support from then Fairfield Ludlowe Head Coach Chris Parisi and a number of dedicated volunteers. The tournament and related fund-raising efforts has now raised nearly \$900,000 in 13 years.
